



CRYSTAL COVE AQUATIC CENTER CLOSED IN 2024


The new design for the pool incorporates many of the ideas generated during discussions with the public. This includes:

EDIBLE COURTYARD

The award-winning Edible Courtyard at the Crystal Community Center strives to cultivate health in the community by offering everyone the ability to grow and pick fresh vegetables, herbs and raspberries. The garden is available for anyone to walk through and harvest fresh produce. Harvested items that go unclaimed are donated to the NEAR Food Shelf in Crystal.

Want to help plant and maintain the garden? No experience is needed to help us out! We work with A Backyard Farm to learn how to maintain and harvest our garden, but we do need the extra hands to get the work done. Volunteering with the Edible Courtyard helps improve food security for individuals and families by connecting the community to nutritional foods. CREEK ROOM

BASSETT CREEK TRAIL



The Bassett Creek Regional Trail is an ideal route for commuting and recreating around the Crystal area. This seven-mile paved, multi-use trail connects French Regional Park in Plymouth to Theodore Wirth Regional Park in Minneapolis.

SKATE PARK

All ages are welcome to skateboard and in-line skate, free of charge.

The skate park is located near the north parking lot of the Crystal Community Center. It is recommended that everyone wears a helmet along with knee, elbow and wrist pads.



DOGS IN THE PARK

Dogs are welcome but must be on a leash shorter than 6 ft. and dog walkers must possess waste-removing utensils. For convenience, cleanup bags are available year-round at Bassett Creek, Valley Place, and Twin Lakes Shores parks. Summer only at Welcome and Twin Oak parks.



Disc Golf Course Improvements

Improvements at the Bassett Creek Park 18-hole Disc Golf Course include new concrete tee pads and baskets.

Some holes were rerouted and others added to bring the course up to 18 holes. In the park's southwest corner, several fairways go through a native prairie restoration area that began in 2023. The prairie grasses take several years to get established.




Expanded Dog Park

The new Bassett Creek Dog Park is located in the NW corner of the park off of 32nd and Brunswick Ave. at 6029 32nd Ave. N.

It is bigger and better with separate areas for big and small dogs. Each area has an accessible trail around the perimeter, benches, a water spigot, and shade for people using the area. A second exit in the large dog area reduces congestion at the main gate.


There is more parking and a new paved path that connects the parking lot to the dog park. You can access the dog park from the former Brunswick Ave.

Due to the location near Bassett Creek, the City of Crystal and Bassett Creek Watershed Management Commission have worked together on signage; reminding dog park users to pick up after their pets. Bags for dog waste and garbage cans for disposal are available at the dog park. The park is free and open from 6 a.m. – 10 p.m.





Park Updates

WELCOME PARK

A new play area and fitness circuit was installed near Welcome Ave. and 46th Ave. The amenities are adjacent to each other so people overseeing children at the play area can do fitness activities. The project was assisted by funding from a Hennepin County Youth Activities Grant.



BROADWAY PARK

This park, near the corner of Broadway Ave. and 59th Ave., was totally rebuilt with a new play area, picnic shelter, basketball court and backstop. Paved trails connect these amenities to 59th Ave. and Shirley Place.

Funding for the project was provided by a federal Community Development Block Grant.




CRYSTAL HIGHLANDS PARK

This park, near the corner of Markwood Dr. and 37th Ave., received a new picnic shelter and basketball court last year. Paved trails connect these amenities to the existing play area, Jersey Circle and Markwood Drive.

Park Map

The City of Crystal has more than 240 acres dedicated to parks and open space. The city maintains 26 parks as well as numerous athletic fields, courts, playgrounds, trails and activity areas.



Crystal's parks are open daily from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. Follow all regulations when visiting the parks.

- Dispose of all debris and litter in trash cans.
- Charcoal grills and fires are prohibited under roofs.
- Do not damage park property or wildlife.
- Glass bottles are prohibited in parks.
- Beer and liquor are prohibited except by permit.
- Permit required for bounce houses and large tents.
- Dogs must be leashed with a leash shorter than 6 feet.
- Dog walkers must possess waste removing utensils.

- Instructors are not permitted to accept registrations.
- Discounts are not given for late registrations.

DATA PRIVACY ADVISORY: The registered participant's name, address and phone number will only be made available to program staff, the city's insurer and attorney and others connected with the program for purposes of administering the activity and providing notice of scheduling changes.

Questions and Answers

When does Summer registration Begin?

Summer registration begins March 1 on-line, in-person or mailed in.

Can I cancel or switch to another class?

Yes. If you need to cancel a class due to illness, moving or schedule conflict, notify us before the registration deadline. A \$5 service fee will be charged on all refunds and transfers. Exception: any event that requires us to pre-order or purchase tickets that are nonrefundable are not eligible for a refund.

Refund requests will not be accepted after the registration deadline. Transfers are possible on a space available basis.

What if the class is full or a minimum is not reached?

All activities have minimum and maximum registrations. When class maximums are reached, no further registrations are accepted and waiting lists are formed. You will be contacted only if your registration can be accepted from the waiting list. When a class minimum has not been reached, the class will be canceled and the entire fee will be refunded.

Is there fee assistance?

The Crystal Recreation Department strives to make our programs as accessible as possible, regardless of ability to pay or income. Assistance is available to Crystal residents under the age of 18 who want to participate in a program and cannot afford normal registration fees. Individuals are required to pay 20% of the program fee.

The Recreation Department reserves the right to determine which programs are applicable for fee assistance.
